## Scheduling for 2021-2022 School Year

## 1. Endorsement Declaration and Approval in Skyward Family Access

The state of Texas' new graduation laws require a student to select an endorsement prior to their $9^{\text {th }}$ grade year. We completely understand that this is very likely to change, but they want the student to have 'direction'. To assist the student with this decision, we had students complete a brief career interest inventory that allowed the career cruising system to determine a few 'Recommended Clusters.' These suggestions are by no means what the

Recommended Clusters

Arts, A/V Technology \& Communications

Law, Public Safety, Corrections \& Security student has to select for their Endorsement. These are just recommendations that correlated with their responses to this inventory. You can view these recommendations on their initial 'My Course Plan' page within Career Cruising, as shown. You may also use the HB 5 Endorsement sheet provided indicating the different career paths and which endorsement it would apply towards.

This entire step must be completed for the scheduling process to be considered complete. Students AND Parents need to log into Skyward Family Access to declare the students intended endorsement and option/specialization.
Your endorsement options include:

- Public Services
- Arts and Humanities
- Business and Industry
- STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math)


## A. Student Portion

1. Login to Family/Student Access and click the Endorsements tab.

2. Click "Declare an Endorsement"

3. Declare an Endorsement and Endorsement option by circking the dropdown arrow. After selecting Endorsement and Endorsement option read the Electronic Signature agreement and check the box next
to "I Agree", this will automatically enter your electronic signature and date. Click Save.


## B. Parent Portion

1. Login to Family/Student Access and click the 'Endorsements' tab.

2. You will see the Endorsement and Endorsement Option that your student selected. Click sign.

3. Read the Electronic Signature agreement and check the box next to "I Agree", this will automatically enter your electronic signature and date. Click Save.


## 2. Course Selection within Career Cruising: Scheduling Instructions

Career Cruising has numerous facets to it that your student will be utilizing over the next four years in their various courses at Lindale High School.

We begin developing your child's portfolio through the scheduling process. This procedure allows students and parents to be engaged and involved through the important decisions that are in the future. Your participation in the scheduling process will allow you to view all courses available, track credits required for graduation, plan elective courses pertinent to a particular major, as well as in the future, interest inventories, career matching, college searches, and much more.

You will be prompted to log in as shown above. Students will need their student ID number and birthday to complete this process.

Once the log-in is processed, students may be prompted to change their password. Please make a note of this new password. The student may also have the opportunity to input an email. Please use the student's school gmail account.

There is a demo video available which provides a detailed tutorial on what the course selection process will look like. It guides you from beginning to end with some sample scheduling selections. Note: This is not a requirement. On the home page,
there is also a link to retrieve the LHS course guide that will contain all of the available courses and their corresponding course descriptions and prerequisites, if needed.

## B. Select 'CHOOSE MY COURSES'

The next screen will be your career cruising dashboard. Look on the left hand column and select,
曲 Choose My Courses. This immediately routes you to 'My Course Plan' where we will begin the scheduling process.
C. MAKING COURSE SELECTIONS Once you are logged into your 'My Course Plan,' you will see the
following layout.


Notes: At any time, you may use the 4 tools at the top right, 3 . legend for various indicators used throughout career cruising. To view all of the available courses and their corresponding course descriptions and prerequisites, you may click on the blue book icon. The third icon is a printer, which you will reference if you would like a hard copy of your final course requests. The suitcase shows educational requirements related to your career interests (which will be further developed and investigated in courses at the high school).

Note: If you took courses in the $8^{\text {th }}$ grade that counted as high school credit, you will see a column to the left of Grade 9 indicating the courses already completed.

At this point, you will need to retrieve your Student Course Selection sheet that your counselor reviewed with you. You will use this as a guide to make your selections. As incoming $9^{\text {th }}$ graders, you will only be making selections for Year 9 at this time. Any courses selected after will not be put into effect.

To make a course selection: You will now click on the appropriate tab. For English I, once you select it, you will be taken to the screen shown.


The courses that meet this requirement will be listed in the pop up screen. You will click on the course title of the class you wish to add. At that time, you will be able to view the course description, any prerequisites, and the successor class following the course selected. If you meet the prerequisites, you can go ahead and select, 'Add Courses.'

## $\checkmark$ Add Courses

Once you make your selection, you will be taken back to your 'My Course Plan,' where the English class will now be shown. You will do this same process for all of the remaining 3 core classes, Math, Science, and History.

For your elective course selections, please read very carefully! Your counselor went into great detail on the requirements by the state for graduation. For $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, we strongly encourage these elective spaces to be used toward meeting these requirements to include: Health/Speech, Computer, Fine Arts, and/or Physical Education. For any remaining elective options, you are encouraged to take a course that will introduce and prepare you for the endorsement you are declaring.

To add these elective courses, you will select the 'Elective' tab. You will be taken to the screen below. You will use the drop down box to select the discipline (for example, English, Agriculture, etc.) and find the course, or you may select to view courses by cluster or keyword. Once you see the course you would like to select, again, you will click the name of the course, and select, $\vee$ add Courses. It will automatically reroute you to your Course Planner home page and indicate your additional course selection.

Details on Selection of Elective courses: Students will have 4 elective slots available after selecting their four core classes. If a student is involved in athletics and/or band, they need to ensure that they select that course(s). After this, we highly recommend that the student register for health/speech (both semester courses). Once you register for one, it will automatically assign the other. Again, we strongly encourage the other elective slots to be filled with the Computer, Fine Arts, and/or Physical Education requirements. This gives them more opportunities in future scheduling to be able to take career oriented classes when these become available.

Note: If you need to delete a course on your course planner, just select it again, and you will see, Delete Course

Once a student indicates their 8 course requests (only 7 for freshman athletes), they will then resume by selecting 3 alternates. These courses MUST be selected in case there is any type of scheduling issue/conflict that arises. The student will not be allowed to submit his/her course requests until 3 alternate selections are made.

Please pay attention to the symbols on your selected courses. You may select a course and see the following two symbols appear by the course, ! and ! . The red symbol notifies you that that course is not available for you for various reasons, and the blue symbol is simply information we want to ensure you are aware of before selecting the course.
D. SUBMITTING COURSE SELECTIONS ON COURSE PLANNER

Career Cruising Course Planner is available for review immediately. Due to the need to familiarize yourself with this site and process, as well as have time to communicate clearly with your parent/guardian and/or current teachers, there are different deadlines set up for each grade level that will prohibit students from submitting course selections until their corresponding date. Keep in mind, once you hit submit, there is no way to go in and edit your selections. It is FINAL which is why there is a warning before final submission.

Once you have made your course selections, and reviewed them with your parent/guardian, you will click, susmit . If there are any errors in your course selection, you will get a message that will pop up telling you what must be corrected in order to proceed.

If there are no errors, a message will come up warning you that you are about to submit. If you agree to the stated terms, simply select susmit !

We do NOT require a print off to be signed. Selecting submit counts as your electronic signature, as well as your parent/guardian's. You are welcome to print it off for your own records, if you prefer.
